| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clinical research at ULHT has been put centre stage with the opening of a £205,000 new research facility at Pilgrim hospital. • Clinical research in Lincolnshire’s hospitals generate approximately £1.6 million for the Trust every year. • The new Lincolnshire Clinical Research Facility provides all of the resources required to run comprehensive research studies and clinical trials at the hospital, for the benefit of staff and patients. • The number of clinical trials and studies carried has increased from 10 to nearly 200 over the last 10 years, with more than 2,000 patients involved a year. • At Pilgrim, the research team is working on a number of trials including oncology, haematology, stroke, cardiology, paediatric, dermatology, diabetes, midwifery, ophthalmology, respiratory, anaesthesia, gastroenterology, renal and orthopaedics. | | | |
