Summary/Key Points:

- A state-of-the-art energy centre was opened at Grantham and District Hospital on Friday 7 October 2016.
- The hyper-efficient energy centre will provide the hospital with improved energy efficient heating and hot water facilities.
- The £650,000 investment in the energy centre coincides with the launch of the Trust's sustainable development management plan (SDMP).
- The Trust is already one of the best performers in the country for reducing its carbon footprint, with a reduction of 13% from 2010 to 2015, compared to the national target of 10% for NHS organisations.
- In partnership with Kier, the new energy centre is an exciting step forward in the Trust providing services more efficiently and at a reduced cost. Taking advantage of the latest technology and investing in our infrastructure will help make further reductions and keep the Trust at the leading edge. It really is a key milestone in the Trust's sustainability plans.
