Trust performance – August 2016

- The Trust did not achieve the 4 hour waiting time target in A&E in July 2016 - 77.80% against a target of 95%
- The 18 week referral to treatment incomplete target was missed in August 2016 - 89.19% against a target of 92%

Three out of the nine cancer targets were achieved in July 2016

The latest mortality position is 101.76 for June 2015 -0 May 2016 (HSMR), which is in the expected range.

The next public Trust Board meeting is on Tuesday 1 November 2016 in the committee room at Pilgrim hospital.

State-of-the-art energy centre opens at Grantham and District Hospital

A new state-of-the-art energy centre has been opened at Grantham hospital by the Lord Lieutenant of Lincolnshire, Toby Dennis.



The hyper-efficient energy centre will provide the hospital with improved heating and hot water facilities following works that involved the replacement of temporary boilers with three new condensing boilers and the laying of new pipework around the hospital.

This £650,000 investment coincides with the launch of United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust's Sustainable Development Management Plan (SDMP) which outlines how the Trust is working towards being even more sustainable and energy efficient.

Lincolnshire to pilot new nursing support role

Health care providers in Lincolnshire will pilot the training of care staff in a brand new nursing support role.

In December 2015, the Government announced a plan to create a new healthcare support role - the nursing associate - that will sit alongside existing nursing care support workers and fully-qualified registered nurses to deliver hands-on care for patients. It has the potential to transform the future of the nursing and care workforce.

The bid from United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust, Lincolnshire Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, Lincolnshire Community Health Services NHS Trust, Lincolnshire Care Association and St Barnabas Lincolnshire Hospice will see the health care providers working together to shape the role, to recruit and train across both hospital and community settings.

At ULHT we will be looking at having our trainee nursing associates particularly at Pilgrim Hospital, Boston to strengthen our workforce, as there are a high number of nursing vacancies currently.

Lincolnshire children have been putting their creative skills to good use to help brighten the walls at Lincoln County Hospital.

Students from Lincoln Minster School were invited to enter a competition to create artwork for a new bereavement centre, due to open at the hospital in the coming months.

Thirteen paintings, sketches and collages were judged in the chapel at the hospital.

What we've been doing

Over the last three months we had number of Trust members acting as patient representatives on different activities. We really appreciate your support and encourage everyone to get involved.

Below is a brief breakdown of what our patient reps have been up to recently:
