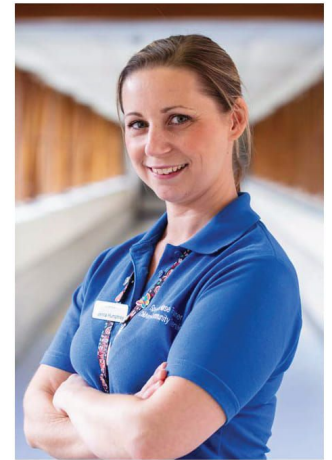
Jenna Humphrey

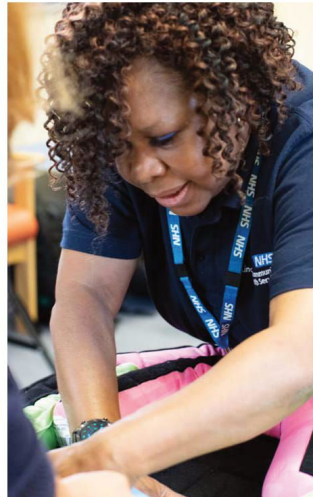

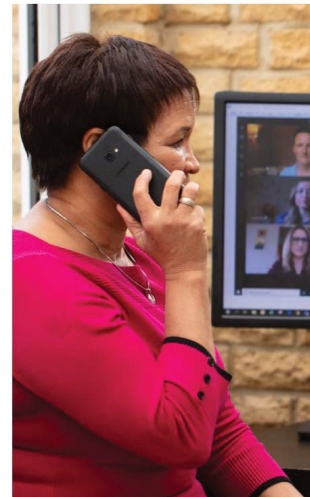

Careers

Relocating to Lincolnshire can involve a career change for more than one person – and understanding the career options available for other family members is important.

Greater Lincolnshire has a diverse and ambitious industrial strategy led by the Greater Lincolnshire Local Enterprise Partnership (GLLEP). With the private sector it is driving investment into engineering, low carbon industries, the agriculture sector through the National Centre for Food Manufacturing, as well as artisan food producers, the visitor economy, the logistical sector and healthcare.

The University of Lincoln recently opened a Science and Innovation Park which is supporting technological

advances and helping entrepreneurs reach new heights in research and design.

As well as these larger operators, there is also around 44,000 SMEs working across Lincolnshire – and the contribution and creativity of each and every one is welcomed and encouraged.

School and Further Education

For those with families, Lincolnshire is home to great schools, with around 90% rated as either good or outstanding by Ofsted. Beyond school years it has a range of education centres for further training and research, including two outstanding universities, seven further education colleges, two university technical colleges as well as many independent training providers.

The University of Lincoln is ranked in the top 20 UK universities by the Guardian and has established an international reputation for the quality of its teaching, research and its innovative approach to working with employers. It has around 16,000 students across its four academic colleges, covering arts, science, business and social sciences subjects and offers more than 300 courses at undergraduate and postgraduate

Transport Connections

Lincolnshire is investing millions to improve roads and transport infrastructure throughout the county, making getting from A to B that much easier.

We have three regional airports and a good motorway network. Lincolnshire is also well-served by trains to the rest of the Midlands including Nottingham, Doncaster, Derby, Sheffield and Leicester. And the East Coast main line to London gives a fast, direct connection between Lincoln and the capital, with travel times just under two hours on LNER's new Azuma fleet.

But it's not all about rail and road, we're also looking at environmentally friendly ways of getting around, so people can carry on working and living in Lincolnshire in the greenest way possible.
