Main duties:						
After the initial induction and assessment of competence the F2 doctor will see patients both routine and those considered to be urgent. Appointment times start at 30 minutes per patient. Once you are comfortable and competent the appointment times will be reduced to 20 minutes. This is usually after about one month. Again, once you are comfortable and competent this will be reduced again to 15 minutes. There is protected debriefing time at the end of each clinic and slots available in the middle of the GP trainers clinic to answer any questions during the clinics. The practice is a training practice with 3 GP trainers. There is no on call or extended hours surgeries for the foundation doctor. The foundation doctor will not be expected to do home visits but may do joint visit's with a Practice Clinician for Learning purposes

The foundation doctor is expected to attend the F2 Training sessions at pilgrim Hospital and attend the weekly Practice Tutorials. The practice arrange a Monthly Educational Training meeting for all GP's and Nurse Practitioners on the third Thursday afternoon of each month. There are other educational activities eg MDT and Safeguarding meetings (monthly) scheduled which the foundation doctor can attend. There are weekly Clinical Management meetings on a Friday morning which the F2 will be expected to attend.						
Other Comments (if appropriate):						
The practice has a strong educational and multiprofessional approach to delivering primary care. The team includes GPs, Advanced Nurse Practioners, Pharmacists, Practice Nurses and Healthcare Support Workers. Occasionally we have several GP registrars and student nurses in post at the same time. There is the usual attachment of community nurses and other allied healthcare professionals.
