<b>Main duties:</b>					
<p>This post will be based at the Carlton Coleby ward which is in Lincoln County hospital. Carlton-Coleby ward is a 28 bedded ward. There are four full time consultants who rotate to work on and off the ward. The foundation trainee will also undertake acute medical oncall. The foundation trainee will be able to satisfy requirements of the Foundation Curriculum and will be supported by the senior trainees and consultant working on the ward. The placement offers direct supervision of clinical practice and workplace based assessments, alongside a clearly delineated role to permit the trainee to meet their Intended Learning Objectives for the foundation programme. The trainee will gain experience in managing acutely unwell respiratory patients including non-invasive ventilation as well as dealing with patients with chronic disease. There is also the opportunity to learn pleural procedures.</p> <p>The medical team on Carlton Coleby ward are responsible for the management of all patients on the ward. These patients have predominately respiratory problems but might have general medical problems too.</p>
