Main Duties:			
<b><u>Job Description</u></b> <b>General Adult Psychiatry, Lincolnshire Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, Lincoln</b> This FT1 post is based in Lincoln at the male acute inpatient ward.  <b>Inpatient Placement (Ellis Ward, Peter Hodgkinson Centre, Lincoln)</b> This post provides experience in acute general adult inpatient psychiatry, working on a busy 19 bedded male general adult acute inpatient ward. The ward averages over 300 acute admissions per year with an average length of stay between 20 and 40 days. The medical team comprises of two Consultant Psychiatrists, one Foundation 1 Trainee, one Foundation 2 Trainee, one CT1 Trainee and two GP Trainees.  The ward prides itself on its multi-disciplinary team approach to patient care and, in addition to the above medical staff; we have a full contingent of junior and senior nursing staff, with further input from an activities co-ordinator, occupational therapy, physiotherapy and psychology. The role of the Foundation 1 Trainee is to be a part of the MDT team in assessing and managing the patients and complete the necessary physical healthcare for our patients. Foundation 1 trainees will be expected to review patients individually on a weekly basis and to present them at MDT clinical review discussions.  At the end of the posting the trainee would aim to gain enough experience to feel confident to be able to manage less complex cases in the primary care setting and have an understanding of the referral systems in place to refer onto secondary and tertiary care. The trainee would be expected to have awareness in the DoH guidelines in managing mental health in primary care setting and the relevant NICE guidelines.  Trainees will have the opportunity to spend time doing 'taster' days in other areas of psychiatry if this is part of their Personal Development Plan and will have the opportunity to observe ECT if they wish to do so.
